

BULBS

Fact Sheet: Home and Terrace Gardening Spring and Summer



Tuck bulbs into soil in the Fall for Spring blooms, and in Spring for Summer flowers.

Guidelines:

- Choose a favorite in one color for a dramatic display or mix bulbs for a multicolor mix
- Be sure containers have drainage
- Use high quality potting soil not leftovers
- Plant bulb as deeply as the plant will be tall. For example, bury tulips or daffodils about eight inches and smaller flowering plants three to four inches down
- Water your bulbs well after planting
- Many bulbs will provide pretty cut flowers for vases
- If you winter outside use pots roomy enough so there is sufficient soil for insulation
- Don't use plastic covering if you are storing bulbs inside after a growing period ends.
